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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 May 2024

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 May 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our purposes, as set out in our constitution, are:

- To advance and promote community development by the regeneration of the Portree and Braes area, including the maintenance or improvements of the physical, social and economic infrastructure and by assisting people who are at a disadvantage due to their social and economic circumstances.
- To preserve, conserve, restore and improve the environment.
- To promote, establish, operate and/or support other schemes and projects with wholly charitable purposes for the benefit of the Community of Portree and Braes.

Volunteers

The Trust's projects are coordinated by sub-groups of Trust members and directors. Volunteer support is critical to the success of these sub groups. The activities of the sub groups are disclosed in the achievement and performance section of the trustees report.

We estimate that our volunteers have contributed 3,500 hours (2023 - 3,750) in the year which at an hourly rate of £10 delivered a value of £35,000 (2023 - £37,500).

This value is not recognised in the financial statements.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities Community Land Purchase

Funding was awarded in December 2023 from the Scottish Land Fund to support the purchase of the King George V Playing Field. A part-time project officer was employed in May on a 1-year contract to oversee the purchase and any related community engagement activities. The project officer and has also been working on a fundraising campaign to raise the shortfall in funding required to purchase the King George V land.

Re-imagining Camanachd Square/Portree Community Centre

In February 2024 funding was awarded from the Community Regeneration Fund to support Portree & Braes Community Trust (PBCT) to employ two staff - a caretaker and a bookings coordinator - to work alongside the Portree Community Centre Association (PCCA) committee to manage the day-to-day operation of the community centre venue. This is a partnership project between the PBCT and the PCCA. PBCT is the lead applicant and official employer. The staff are contracted for 7 hours per week each for 1 year from the 1st of June 2024.

Events (Light Up Portree)

The Light Up Portree Community Events programme continues to be well received. The Autumn Fling event family fun day and 90's disco were delivered in September 2023, a Halloween Family Party was delivered in October 2023 and the annual Reindeer parade and Hogmanay events were delivered towards the end of the year. All income from events was used to cover event costs and support future events. The Light up Portree group also helped to promote other live music events in the year including the DJ Ewan McVicar, traditional band Trail West and Beat the Drum; The Runrig experience. Light Up Portree also provided stewarding / bar services for these events and this provided additional income generating opportunities for the Light Up Portree group and for other Trust projects.

Bayfield Car Park

The Highland Council continues to operate the community owned carpark at Bayfield with the Trust receiving an annual rental payment and a % of the profits. The campervan waste disposal unit is still managed directly by the Trust and generates a modest but useful income. There is minimal ongoing maintenance required and limited overhead costs incurred in the operation of this facility.

ACE Academy continues in their stewardship role to oversee the conservation of Bayfield woodland. No further organised outdoor education sessions took place in this financial year.

Paths

Several small projects were delivered under the paths group in this financial year; a vegetation clearance project, funded jointly by the Ward Discretionary Fund and the Portree and Braes Community Council; a project to plant summer bedding plants and spring bulbs in the village, funded by Rabbies Trailblazers; the installation of a bespoke "Go" game board in the centre of the village; and the addition of two new public benches in Somerled Square.

Playparks

The building works were completed for the new playpark at Matheson Place and the park was officially opened in July 2023. There have since been a few small expenditures relating to park maintenance. The park is otherwise operating well and is highly valued by the local community.

Portree Harbour

This harbour group is currently inactive however the PBCT continue to monitor Portree harbour for development opportunities.

Allotments

A project officer continued to work with the voluntary allotments committee throughout the 23/24 period to deliver the Community Regeneration funded project. Funding was provided for additional infrastructure at the allotment site, including a summer house and polytunnels, to support community growing. At the end of the financial year there was an underspend on this project, so an extension was granted. Project funds are managed through a separate PBCT bank account which the committee have direct access to.

Helipad

The trust continues to manage the helipad. The facility generates modest donations from commercial users which contributes towards maintenance costs.

Toilets

The trust continues to own and manage the public toilets facility at the harbour.

Advertising

Advertising spaces are still being sold at The Green carpark. This income is used to support the costs of running the PBCT owned toilet facility at the harbour.

Health

The Health Services Community Engagement Officer took maternity leave from the end of January 2023. Funding was then secured from NHS Education Scotland and NHS Highland to continue the Community Engagement Officer post. A new, two-year contract was issued from 1st January 2024 for the Community Engagement Officer to continue to work with partners to address issues surrounding recruitment and retention of health and social care staff in the area through the "Work on Skye" project.

Skye Community Response

The Skye Community Response funding continued to be held in a separate bank account. There was some expenditure incurred in this financial year relating to communications around the future of Skye Community Response.

Gaelic Education

The "Speak up for Gaelic" Gaelic conversation project continued to be delivered by volunteers with one afternoon session held each week at a local café with tea and cake provided free of charge for participants.

National Park Consultation

The Trust secured a grant of £6000 from the Ward Discretionary Fund to pay a consultant to deliver a Skye-wide community consultation on the proposal of a national park status for Skye and Raasay.

General

The trust remains a member of the Development Trusts Association Scotland (DTAS).

A full time Development Officer was employed throughout this financial period who is responsible for line-managing staff members. A 95% grant payment allocation was provided by funders HIE in this financial year towards the Development Officer. This compares to 100% in the previous financial year. To help meet the funding shortfall sub-groups contributed at least £300 per group to support the continuation of the Development Officer post.

The Trust continued to employ a Finance and Administration Officer throughout this period. From 1st May 2024 this position was no longer grant funded.

A strategic review took place throughout the financial year by accountants Campbell Stewart MacLennan & Co. A draft report was available by the end of the 23/24 period.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Trust's principal sources of Funding in the year under review were:

- Highlands & Islands Enterprise
- NHS
- Scottish Land Fund via National Lottery Community Fund
- Public donations

Reserves policy

As at 31 May 2024 the charity's unrestricted reserves were £120,234 (2023 - £86,803) of which £72,976 (2023 - £41,348) are free reserves. This includes an unrestricted designated £27,000 contingency fund for the day-to-day running of the Trust in case of an emergency.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland applicable in the UK and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land	-	0% on cost
Improvements to Land	-	2% on cost
Equipment	-	15% on reducing balance
Computer Equipment	-	33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
