Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 May 2023

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 May 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our purposes, as set out in our constitution, are:

- To advance and promote community development by the regeneration of the Portree and Braes area, including the maintenance or improvements of the physical, social and economic infrastructure and by assisting people who are at a disadvantage due to their social and economic circumstances.
- To preserve, conserve, restore and improve the environment.
- To promote, establish, operate and/or support other schemes and projects with wholly charitable purposes for the benefit of the Community of Portree and Braes.

Volunteers

The Trust's projects are coordinated by sub-groups of Trust members and directors. Volunteer support is critical to the success of these sub groups. The activities of the sub groups are disclosed in the achievement and performance section of the trustees report.

We estimate that our volunteers have contributed 3,750 hours (2022 - 3,700) in the year which at an hourly rate of £10 delivered a value of £37,500 (2022 - £37,000).

This value is not recognised in the financial statements.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Re-imagining Camanachd Square (Coastal Communities Fund)

An options appraisal and masterplan were undertaken producing a long-term vision for the development of the Camanachd Square area in Portree. The trust worked closely with The Portree Community Centre Association and other local community groups, charities, agencies, and organisations to produce this plan.

Events (Light Up Portree)

The Light Up Portree Community Events programme continues to be well received. The group delivered a weekend of celebratory events in June for the Queen's Jubilee, a family-fun music festival in September, a reindeer parade and Christmas extravaganza in November and The Hogmanay Hoolie Street party in December.

Bayfield

The Highland Council continues to operate the community owned carpark at Bayfield. The campervan waste disposal unit is managed by the trust and continues to generate a modest profit for the trust. Funds were also received from The Highland Council Ward Discretionary Fund for the trust to remove overgrowth from the banks surrounding the carpark.

ACE Academy continues in their stewardship role to oversee the conservation of Bayfield woodland. A six-week outdoor education programme was delivered by ACE Academy and funded directly by Portree Primary School. Future activity depends on available funding from the primary school.

Paths

Small groundwork jobs such as improving paths, planting trees, and clearing overgrowth were commissioned by The Trust with a donation made available by the Skye Games Committee. The trust has taken a step back from the Tigh Na Drochaid Garden project and the management team at Tigh Na Drochaid are coordinating with volunteers to maintain the space.

Community Land Purchase

Fundraising for a new playpark in Matheson Place was ongoing with the fundraising target being reached by the end of the accounting period. The PBCT secured a 15-year lease on the identified site and a deposit was paid on the equipment.

Portree Harbour

The Levelling Up Fund bid submitted by the Highland Council and supported by The Portree and Braes Community Trust was unfortunately rejected, and The Highland Council have no plans to resubmit for the next round. The PBCT Harbour group continue to take an interest in investment opportunities at the harbour however.

Allotments

The site purchase was finalised and funding for a further year of PT project officer time was approved. A range of community engagement event and activities took place, e.g seed swapping and BBQ's. Towards the end of the accounting period a separate bank account was set up so that the allotments project committee could manage the finances relating to the project directly.

Helipad

The trust continues to manage the helipad. The facility generates modest donations from commercial users which contributes towards maintenance costs.

Toilets

The trust continues to own and manage the public toilets facility at the harbour.

Advertising

Advertising spaces are still being sold at The Green carpark. This income is used to support the costs of running the PBCT owned toilet facility at the harbour.

<u>Health</u>

Due to the uncertainty around the future of the delivery of the Sir Lewis Ritchie recommendations the Community Engagement (health) Officer contract came to an end in February 2023.

Skye Community Response

A public meeting was advertised to establish a new committee with a more suitable structure to hold the remaining funds so that the funds could be transferred out of the PBCT account.

Gaelic Education

The "Speak up for Gaelic" Gaelic conversation project continued to employ a project officer until October 2022 who organised two get-together sessions each week. After October the project was delivered on a voluntary basis with one afternoon session held each week at a local café with tea and cake provided.

General

The trust remains a member of the Development Trusts Association Scotland (DTAS). A full time Development Officer was employed throughout this accounting period who line-managed any staff members. One new member was added to the register of members.

Reserves policy

The SCIO does not currently hold any policy in relation to the retention of free reserves which are those unrestricted funds not invested in fixed assets, designated to a specific purpose or otherwise committed.

As at 31 May 2023 the charity's unrestricted reserves were £86,803 (2022 - £83,576) of which £41,348 (2022 - £38,136) are free reserves. This includes an unrestricted designated £10,000 contingency fund for the day-to-day running of the Trust in case of an emergency.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Portree & Braes Community Trust is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation and its purpose and administrative arrangements are set out in our Constitution.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The board may at any time appoint any member to be a charity trustee. The minimum number of trustees is five and the maximum number is twenty.

Key management remuneration

The trustees who are the key management of the charity, recieved no remuneration in the year ended 31 May 2023 nor for the year ended 31 May 2022.

1. **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

- 0% on cost Land - 2% on cost Improvements to Land

- 15% on reducing balance Equipment

- 33% on cost Computer Equipment

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Transfers between funds

Funds received for capital expenditure, which have been fully expended in accordance with the restrictions imposed, have been transferred to unrestricted funds. These are accounted for as designated funds in order to track the net book value of related asset.

During the year, the following transfers were made:

- the Events Group donated a total of £587 to the Playparks restricted fund which was transferred.
- £1,044 and £1,069 was transferred from general unrestricted funds to the designated unrestricted toilets and paths & walks funds respectively, to cover net expenditure in these funds during the year.
- £3,489 was transferred from the unrestricted designated Coastal Communities Fund to the restricted Camanachd Square project since expenditure on the project commenced in the year, in addition to restricted funds being awarded.
- £1,200 was transferred from the restricted Speak Up For Gaelic fund to unrestricted funds after an
 agreement was reached with the funders that these funds could be used for the charity's general
 management expenses.
- £105 was transferred from the designated Bayfield fund to the Highland Council motorhome waste disposal unit fund as fixed assets purchased in the previous financial year were allocated and depreciated under the designated fund. A restricted grant from the Highland Council was received in this financial year to cover some of the capital costs. As a result, the part of the fixed asset was moved to the restricted disposal unit fund as well as the depreciation.

13. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

Portree Braes Community Centre Association SCIO (PCCA) and Portree Braes Community Trust SCIO (PBCT) have aligned objectives in the development of the building for the benefit of the local community.

Despite the committee having strong representation from PBCT the association remains a separate entity and retains ownership of the building.

During the year, the following transactions occurred:

PBCT paid expenses totalling £5,914 (2022 - £3,326) on behalf of PCCA.

PBCT recieved grant income totalling £38,082 (2022 - £Nil) on behalf of PCCA.

PBCT recieved bank transfers totalling £5,914 (2022 - £3,326) and paid bank transfers totalling £38,082 (2022 - £Nil) to PCCA.
